

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Medical College of Wisconsin 2024 Solid Organ Transplant Symposium will be held on April 13, 2024, at the Renaissance Milwaukee West Hotel, located at 2300 N. Mayfair Road, Wauwatosa, WI 53226.

TARGET AUDIENCE: Gastroenterologists, nephrologists, advanced practice providers, nurses, social workers, dietitians, dialysis technicians

PURPOSE: This educational activity is designed with two parallel tracks for a diverse audience. The symposium will highlight best practices, access, and innovation in pancreas and kidney transplantation, and contemporary issues in liver disease management, to include hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC), liver failure, and acute alcoholic hepatitis (AAH). Invited speakers include distinguished academic providers who can provide up-to-date summaries of the topics.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES: Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

- Explain the current listing criteria for kidney and pancreas transplantation, and the new options that increase access to organ offers.
- Counsel patients on the available options for organ matching and utilize available resources that remove disincentives to donation.
- Discuss the efficacy, safety, and anticipated outcomes for treatment therapies for HCC management, including neoadjuvant regimens, surgical resection, liver transplant, and palliative care.
- Incorporate best practice medical management of liver cirrhosis, portal hypertension and acute-on-chronic liver failure.
- Evaluate patients with severe AAH and recent heavy alcohol use for liver transplantation and apply appropriate cognitive, behavioral, and pharmacologic therapies for alcohol use disorder (AUD) patients.

EDUCATIONAL METHOD: The format will include lectures from leaders in each field, panel discussions, and case presentations led by moderators. There will be ample opportunity for questions and discussion.

Alexandre Louvet, MD, PhD, is a Professor of Hepatology at the Lille University Hospital in Lille, France. Dr. Louvet received his medical degree from the University of Lille and subsequently completed a PhD at the Mondor Institute for Biomedical Research in Créteil, France. His doctorate research focused on the role of the endocannabinoid system in alcoholic liver disease in mice. Dr. Louvet's clinical research centers on alcoholic hepatitis and its treatment, disease modeling, transplantation and pathophysiology. Dr. Louvet's clinical interests include ALD, non-alcoholic fatty liver disease, viral hepatitis, and hepatocellular carcinoma.
