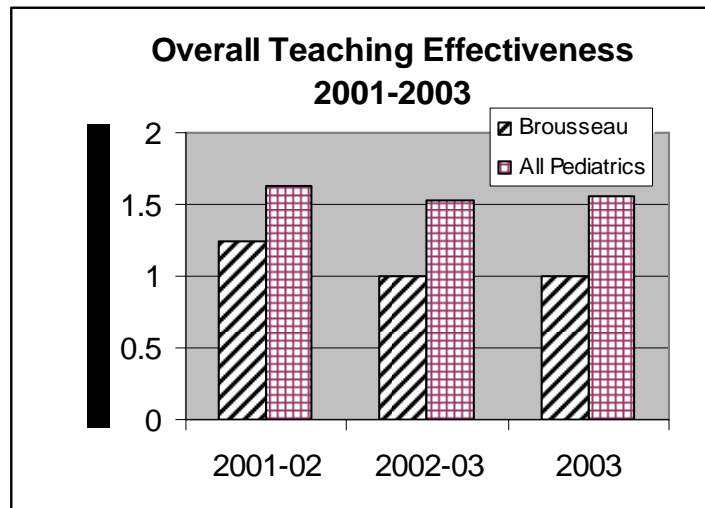

1. Overall Teaching Effectiveness Evaluations for Pediatric resident teaching

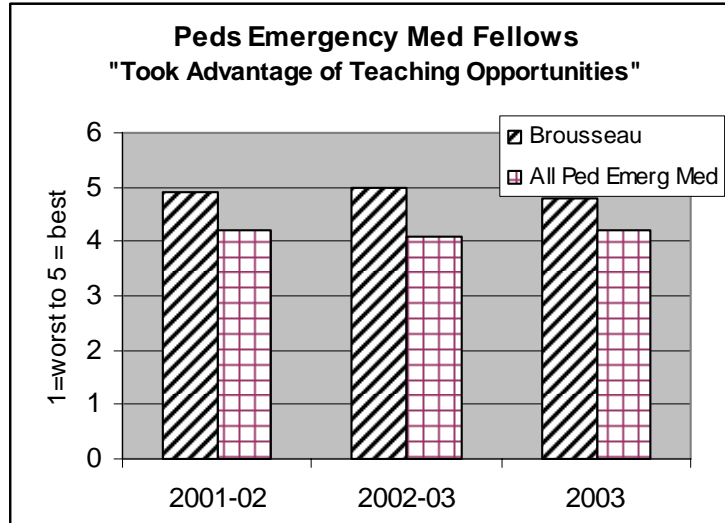


C. Representative Resident Comments
