DIVERSITY SUMMER HEALTH-related RESEARCH PROGRAM (DSHREP)
GUIDELINES**

Students interested in participating in the 2010 Diversity Summer Health-related Education Program (DSHREP) must be available for ten weeks, **May 24, 2010** through **August 3, 2010**. Travel funds to and from Milwaukee are available to student researcher(s) who do not reside within Wisconsin. Housing accommodations are provided for student researcher(s) whose permanent address is outside of the Milwaukee area. Students are paid a salary of \$10.00/hr based on a 40 hr work week for the summer.

ELIGIBILITY: Students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Be from an economically and/or educationally disadvantaged background
- Have successfully completed at least one undergraduate year at an accredited school or university, or attending a junior or community college and be enrolled in at least three courses per academic term
- Possess a strong science and math GPA of at least 3.0 (This is a competitive program)
- Show proof of health insurance prior to the start of the program

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: Attendance is mandatory at all seminars and training activities. Each researcher is required to prepare an abstract of their research and present a brief presentation of their project at the conclusion of the summer experience. Researchers must comply with all Medical College of Wisconsin policies and rules of conduct in regard to the workplace and personal behavior, the conduct of research and patient privacy, as well as housing.

- 2 Letters of Recommendation
