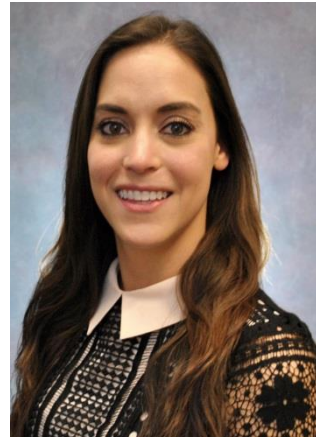

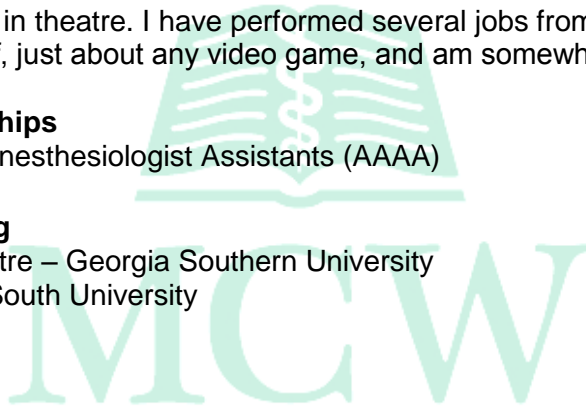

Teaching Philosophy

"I believe the clinical setting should be an opportunity for the learner to be pushed beyond their comfort level in a variety of situations. They should strive to communicate with surgeons, nurses, patients, and preceptors with confidence and curiosity while the preceptor's role should be to guide them from one level to the next.
