BAYFIELD COUNTY

The information presented here represents data specific to Bayfield County, Wisconsin from 2001-2006, and is meant to complement the report, *The Burden of Suicide in Wisconsin*. Please refer to this report for technical notes and suicide prevention strategies. For counties with fewer than 20 suicides each year, data are aggregated for 2001-2006 and findings are presented in bullets rather than tables.

KEY FINDINGS

- ♦The suicide rate in Bayfield County for all years was higher than the state rate for all years (14.0‡ versus 11.8).
- ◆Suicide represented a total of 328 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 382.7 for 2001-2006. This was less than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.
- ◆The cost of inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department visits due to self-inflicted injury was over \$212,000 in 2006 alone.
- ♦ Firearms were the most frequently used method in Bayfield County suicides (77%) followed by hanging, strangulation, or suffocation (15%).
