
KEY FINDINGS

- ◆The suicide rate in Milwaukee County was below the state rate for all years except 2001 and 2004, when it was slightly higher.
- ◆Suicide represented a total of 19,269 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 367.8 for 2001-2006. This was less than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.
- ◆The greatest number of suicides and hospitalizations occurred in individuals aged 35-44, while the greatest number of emergency department visits occurred in younger individuals, aged 15-24. The numbers for deaths and emergency department visits are similar to the findings for the state, hospitalizations occurred in older individuals in Milwaukee County as compared to the state.
- ◆The cost of inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department visits due to self-inflicted injury was over \$12.9 million in 2006 alone.
- ♦Firearms were the most frequently used method in Milwaukee County suicides (41%).
