## **POLK COUNTY**

The information presented here represents data specific to Polk County, Wisconsin from 2001-2006, and is meant to complement the report, *The Burden of Suicide in Wisconsin*. Please refer to this report for technical notes and suicide prevention strategies. For counties with fewer than 20 suicides each year, data are aggregated for 2001-2006 and findings are presented in bullets rather than tables.

## **KEY FINDINGS**

- ◆The suicide rate in Polk County for all years was lower than the state rate for all years (11.4 versus 11.8).
- ♦ Suicide represented a total of 986 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 406.3.1 for 2001-2006. This was more than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.
- ◆The greatest number of suicides occurred in individuals aged 45-54, while the greatest number of hospitalizations and emergency department visits occurred in younger individuals, aged 15-24. This finding is the same at the state level.
- ♦The cost of inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department visits due to self-inflicted injury was over \$96,000 in 2006 alone.
- ♦ Firearms were the most frequently used method in Polk County suicides (83%) followed by poisoning (10%) and hanging, strangulation, or suffocation (7%).
