



# The path of our DOC Opioid Epidemic and our Data

"Nobody woke up in the morning and said, 'I want to be a heroin addict because it sounds super awesome."




(All Overdose-related Situation Alerts, by Incident, not offender)

# DAI SUD Treatment Options

### Current SUD Needs

### As of 12/1/2020...

- DAI had roughly 23,100 individuals in our care
- 9.808 individuals in our care have an identified SUD need and are on the waitlist for treatment
- 823 individuals in our care are currently enrolled in SUD programming
- 450 individuals in our care are currently enrolled in Earned Release Programming
- 28 individuals in our care are currently enrolled in Challenge Incarceration Programming

### Assessment

#### TAAD5 (Triage Assessment for Addictive Disorders - 5)

- Brief structured interview designed to identify current alcohol and drug problems
- Covers all DSM-5 criteria for substance use disorders
- Allows for a fast, initial discrimination between a likely substance use disorder and no diagnosis

COMPAS risk level identified by the COMPAS assessment tool

Individuals are assigned a SUD level based on a combination of their TAAD5 results on and their COMPAS risk level

## SUD Level

#### SUD1

• Individual Case Plan Intervention with assigned Social Worker

#### SUD2

- Low dosage required
- Group and Individual treatment with SUD treatment staff

#### SUD3

- Moderate dosage required
- Group and Individual treatment with SUD treatment staff

#### SUD4

- Highest level of dosage required
- Group and Individual treatment with SUD treatment staff

# Wisconsin Women's Correctional System Programming

SUD1 – Case plan intervention with general population social worker/case manager

SUD2 – Helping Women Recover and Connections (12 weeks) SUD3 – Helping Women Recover, Connections, Moving On, and Seeking Safety (15 weeks) SUD4 – Helping Women Recover, Connections, Moving On, Seeking Safety, and DBT Informed Skills Group (17 weeks)

# Men's System Programming

SUD1 – Case Plan Intervention with general population social worker/case manager

SUD2 – Cognitive Behavioral Intervention for Substance Abuse (CBI-SA) (12 weeks)

SUD3 – CBI-SA and Thinking for a Change (T4C) (18-20 weeks) SUD4 – CBI-SA, T4C, and Epictetus with General Skills plus needed ancillaries (20 weeks)

- Domestic Violence
- Anger Management/Anger Control
- Advanced Practice

# SUD Program Options

### Earned Release Programming (ERP)

Earned Release Program is driven by statute and allows judges to sentence non-violent, non-assaultive individuals with a substance use disorder to this program.

### Challenge Incarceration Program (CIP)

Challenge Incarceration Program is a statutorily established program that allows judges to sentence non-violent, non-assaultive individuals with substance abuse needs to this full-time intensive program that combines physical fitness and well-being with SUD treatment.

# Non-ERP SUD treatment

Residential SUD treatment who are not ERP/CIP eligible.

# Release Planning for SUD Program Participants

ERP/CIP participants release plan with their program provider (treatment specialist or social worker) and SUD residential participants continue to work with their general population social worker. The DCC Agent is also involved in the release planning process.

Education is provided on treatment and resource options.

Referrals are made for any treatment and/or programs the individual is interested in becoming involved in.

Appointments are scheduled and plans are made for first few weeks to months of release.

# Opioid Use History Specific Release Planning

DAI and DCC work collaboratively with person in our care to determine best route for aftercare and/or ongoing treatment.

Medication Assisted Treatment options are reviewed, education materials are provided, and referrals are made.

Vivitrol injections are offered pre-release at several DAI sites if the person in our care voluntarily enrolls in the program.

Some sites that are not offering Vivitrol are offering Oral Naltrexone to persons in our care until they are able to be seen by a medical/treatment provider in the community.

DAI is hoping to expand the ability of sites to offer Vivitrol pre-release by bringing additional institutions on board.

- Re-entry Phone call between Agent and DAI Social Worker begin at 6 months prior to release






