



A GUIDE TO GIVING: OPPORTUNITIES FOR PHILANTHROPIC INVESTMENT IN GLOBAL HEALTH

Naming of the Medical College of Wisconsin Global Health Center

Global Health Program is a new and emerging program of the Medical College. Income generated from a named endowment will support program development and recruitment of local and internationally prominent physicians and researchers.

Giving level: \$10 million

Named Endowed Chair in Global Health

An endowed chair is the most significant form of recognition the College can bestow on a faculty member, as well as a powerful financial tool for attracting and retaining first-rate faculty. Named chairs in Global Health Education, Research, and Clinical Care are available.

Giving level: \$1 - \$1.5 million

Postdoctoral Fellowship Position

Postdoctoral research fellows conduct research under the guidance of senior faculty. Fellowships are awarded competitively to talented MD and PhD graduates who have a leading role in the search for improved patient outcomes and the cure for disease. Fellows often pursue innovative scientific research across disciplines, which later leads to federal grant awards.

Giving level: \$150,000/3 Years

Global Health Research Seed Funds

Seed funds are used by faculty to support innovative scientific discovery. Financial support covers the costs for laboratory supplies, specialized equipment, and international collaborators and staff time.

Giving level: \$25,000 and up

Equipment Purchase

Support for specialized equipment purchases is vital to discovery in the basic sciences and translational research. Equipment can assist local and international collaborators with research initiatives that advance outcomes in patient care and prevent global mortality.

Giving level: \$50,000 and up

Global Scholarship Fund for International Physician Travel

The availability of scholarships helps the College host international trainees and physicians from collaborating countries from around the world to observe our state-of-the-art medical care. These trainees and physicians can learn techniques that can be brought back to their developing countries to save lives around the globe.

Giving level: \$3,000 and up

Global Research Summer Program (Student Sponsorship)

First, second and third year medical students can explore biomedical research during a 10-week hands-on summer research experience. Students spend 5 weeks addressing health disparities in Milwaukee and then 5-weeks international. Participating students receive a minimum stipend of \$3,500.

Giving level: \$3,500 and up

Medical Spanish Course for Medical Students

Throughout their careers, regardless of where they choose to practice, Medical College of Wisconsin graduates will have to communicate on several levels with patients whose only language is Spanish. An elective in Medical Spanish will train students in medical vocabulary needed for basic communication with Spanish-speaking patients. In addition to language skills, the course includes exploration of Spanish culture and the impact of this culture on the interaction between the Spanish-speaking patient, their family and the health care system. Funds will be used to hire an instructor and provide associated costs for the course.

Giving level: \$3,000

Medical Student Travel Abroad (Global Health Elective)

Scholarships help the Medical College assist students to travel to low-resource countries to experience settings outside of the United States. Students are motivated to serve global patients and to come back to the US to serve their communities. This is a fourth-year elective, typically covering a few weeks.

Giving level: \$1,000 and up
