The primary adult teaching affiliate of MCW, Froedtert Hospital is a major training facility for more than 1,000 medical nursing and health technical students annually.
- Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, with 300 beds, is a private, independent, not-for-profit health care system dedicated solely to the health and well-being of children.
- Zablocki Veterans Affairs Medical Center, a 309-bed medical center staffed by faculty of The Medical College of Wisconsin.

## Milwaukee, Wisconsin

Milwaukee is a wonderful community that has the advantage of an urban, metropolitan city without the stress or cost. Milwaukee is the largest city in Wisconsin and the 31<sup>st</sup> largest nationwide. Milwaukee has an estimated population of 590,157 (2019), and an area covering nearly 100 square miles. The four-county metropolitan area (Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington and Waukesha counties) has an estimated population of more than 1.6 million (2017).

A City-Data.com study (2017) revealed a rich blend of ethnic groups, comprised of 35 percent Caucasian, 39 percent African-American, 19 percent Hispanic, 4 percent Asian, and 3 percent other.
