

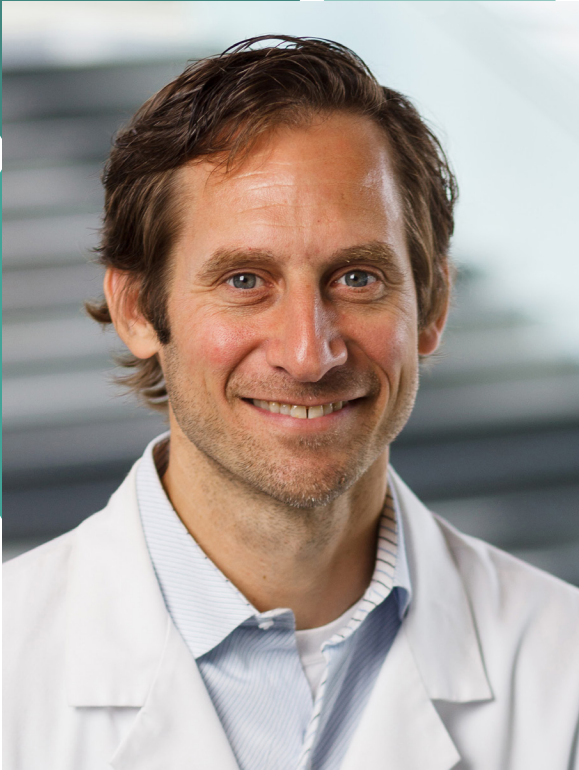

# A Message from the Department Chair



We are going to be hearing a lot about the patient experience in the coming months. Patient experience encompasses all facets of care beginning with how patients and their families access the system through the management, and hopeful satisfactory resolution of their health care issue. Patient experience is different, but closely tied to patient satisfaction. As many of you have noted, patient satisfaction scores have numerous factors associated with them, some within our direct control, but many not.

I recently spent time planning a summer vacation for my family which gave me an opportunity to see customer experience through a different lens. Even though I was working on something I was excited about and looking forward to – a far cry from the fear and uncertainty associated with a medical problem, I found the experience frustrating on many levels. Here are some of my impressions regarding my experience as a consumer as well as thoughts on how it relates to how we can better meet the needs of our patients.

1. There is an enormous amount of information available on the internet, but it is unclear what information to trust. Multiple favorable reviews from diverse online sites made me feel more confident. Positive word of mouth from someone I actually knew reinforced what I had researched and discovered online.  
*We have made significant efforts to improve our website. Links or suggestions to valuable online resources for our patients strengthens the trust they have in our care. Word of mouth remains the cornerstone of building a thriving practice.*
2. Flexibility is important. The experience I was hoping to create for my family is unique and doesn't fit into any pre-set vacation or itinerary. Additionally, life is unpredictable and committing to a vacation 6 months from now was anxiety-provoking.  
*Every patient's situation is unique. For patients to have a truly satisfactory experience we need to be able to ask about, consider, and adapt to their individual needs.*
3. Web-based access, information and scheduling was helpful, but I invariably needed a person to talk to, answer questions, and personalize the experience. The professionalism of that person including their knowledge and attitude set my expectations for the rest of the experience.  
*The expectations for our patients begin at their entry point into the system and the welcome they receive at every touch point. Everyone plays a vital role in the patient experience.*
4. Efficiency matters. When faced with the option of a direct flight, short layover, or long layover, I was willing to pay a premium for my time and convenience.  
*Taking the extra time to coordinate multiple tests or appointments for a patient in one afternoon so they don't have to take multiple days off of work or figure out childcare is a tremendous satisfier and shows we care about them as a person.*

5. Consistently meeting expectations builds confidence and trust and enhances the overall experience.  
*High-reliability organizations understand the value of delivering on expectations. Our reputation as quality providers is only reinforced if we deliver every time on the patient experience.*

My challenge to you is to personally think about what makes a good experience for you and make every effort to invest in enhancing the experience of our patients. 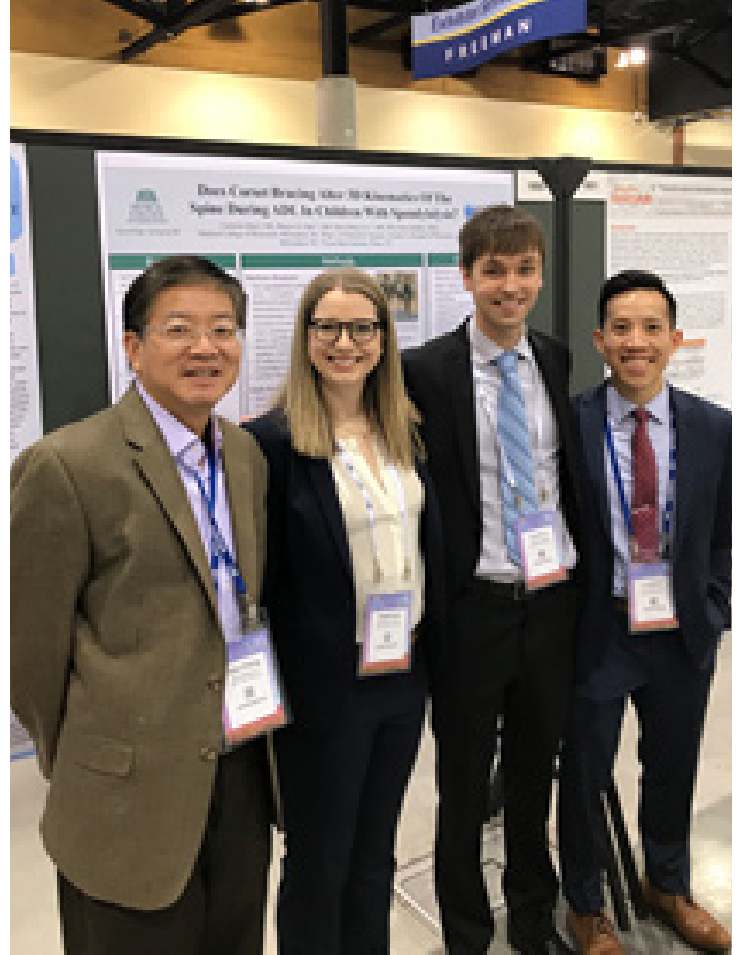


## Summer Research Student Wins Award

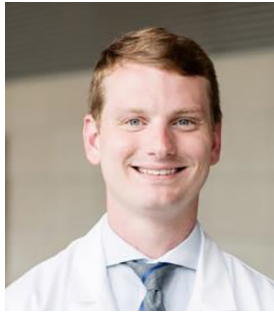
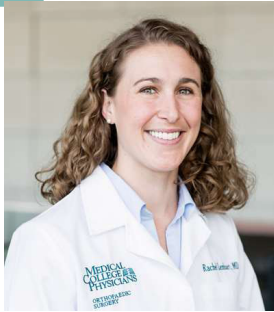

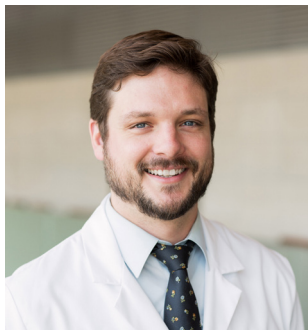


## Resident Presentations

## Welcome to CFAC 6!

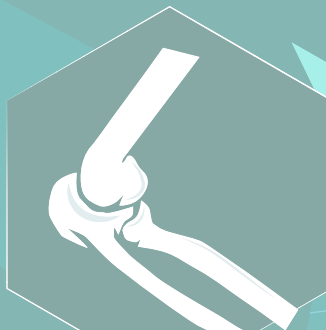
