Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship

The Neonatal-Perinatal Fellowship at MCW and Children's Hospital of Wisconsin (CHW) is an outstanding training program for those specializing in the care of critically ill newborns. You will have the opportunity to master your skills in patient care, research, and education at the largest level IV NICU in Wisconsin, including patients from Wisconsin, Michigan and Illinois. Our three-year training program provides the opportunity for fellows to care for the entire spectrum of newborn diseases, including those born at extremely low birth weight, who have surgical and subspecialty needs, and who are critically ill. Our faculty are recognized as experts in both bedside care and academic medicine, bringing in millions in NIH funding. Our graduates have achieved success in both academic medicine and private practice.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Our NICU is a "fellow-run unit." Fellows work closely with attendings, neonatal nurse practitioners, and residents and oversee all aspects of clinical care in the NICU. Our fellows quickly master procedural skills in our busy 70-bed NICU and routinely go out on transport, by ground and air, for critically ill neonates in our catchment area. Our fellows develop strong clinical skills through managing both premature babies and a high volume of babies with complex congenital anomalies.

RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Our fellows can participate in a scholarly project with internationally recognized experts in their fields. Fellows will select a project that meets their long-term goals, acquiring the research skills that will poise them for a successful academic career. Our fellows frequently present at local, national, and international conferences.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

Our curriculum focuses on training and developing outstanding neonatologists. Our weekly conferences provide a wide variety of educational topics, including neonatal pathophysiology, clinical case reviews, evidence-based medicine, and journal clubs.
