Pediatric Critical Care Medicine Fellowship

The Pediatric Critical Care Fellowship at MCW/Children's Hospital of Wisconsin is highly dedicated to not only maintaining the tradition of excellence within our training program but also leading the way in clinical, scholarly and educational offerings for our trainees. We promise to foster the growth and development of our trainees by providing them with a truly exceptional, well-rounded educational experience while constantly re-examining not only what we teach, but how we teach it.

FELLOWSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- 16 months of clinical work and 20 months of research activities.
- This first year is highly clinically focused with exposure to a diverse patient population across the medical, surgical/trauma and cardiac pediatric ICUs.
- Service during second and third years is done one week at a time, allowing for increased time dedicated to scholarly project and career development.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

First Year Fellows serve 24 weeks in the PICU, 8 weeks in Anesthesiology, 18 weeks on research and two weeks in transport. Second Year fellows serve 14 weeks in the PICU, 38 weeks on research and participate in a variety of electives. Third year fellows serve 16 weeks in the PICU, 36 weeks on research and participate in a variety of electives. All fellows participate within the in-house overnight call schedule, trauma team and inter-hospital transport coverage.

RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Fellows meet regularly with our dedicated Fellowship Research Directors as well as with their Scholarly Oversight Committee. These meetings are utilized to assist in identification of fellow research interests, determine project feasibility and foster academic growth and development. Over the course of 3 years, fellows will participate in a guided scientific writing curriculum which will culminate in abstract submission to a national/international conference as well as preparation for peer review publication consideration.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

In addition to the high volume/high acuity clinical and guided-research experiences, our fellows participate in a wide variety of educational offerings specifically tailored to supplement their hands-on learning including: educational conferences focused on the American Board of Pediatrics Core Content Specifications, Simulation, System Improvement and Case-Review Conferences and small group discussions, weekly RESCQ (Research, Ethics, Safety, Career Development and Quality) Conference, Neuro-Critical Care Conference, and more!
