Amalia Cochran, MD, FACS, FCCM, is a graduate of Texas A&M University for both her BA in Political Science and her MD. She received her general surgery training at the University of Utah and her burn/critical care training at Shriners' Hospital for Children in Galveston. Her clinical practice focuses on acute burn care, critical care in burns, and burn reconstruction. She is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and of the American College of Critical Care Medicine.

Dr. Cochran is the Vice Chair of Education and Director of Professionalism for the Department of Surgery at The Ohio State University as well as the Director of the OSU Burn Center, where she holds the American Electric Power Foundation Chair for Burn Care. She has completed a Surgical Education Research Fellowship, has won university-wide and national teaching awards and was named an Outstanding Alumna of Texas A&M College of Medicine in 2016. Her research interests lie in the areas of education, clinical outcomes, and the use of technology to enhance surgical education and patient care.

Her current research projects in education address barriers to academic surgical careers and the impact of disruptive surgeon behavior. Her current clinical research priorities include management and outcomes in frostbite, optimizing burn shock resuscitation, and telemedicine as a means to address healthcare disparities in rural and frontier regions.

Dr. Cochran has a number of leadership roles away from the University, including serving as Past President for the Association of Women Surgeons and Immediate Past President of the Association for Surgical Education. She is a member of the American College of Surgeons Board of Governors.
