SCHOLARLY ACTIVITIES

735 MD & PHARMD STUDENTS



were enrolled in Scholarly Pathways in 2018-2019. Scholarly Pathways allow students to individualize their MCW educational experience.

FROM THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE CLASS OF 2019:

108 STUDENTS REPORTED AT LEAST ONE SCHOLARLY DISSEMINATION

representing **345** scholarly citations (articles, abstracts, posters, oral presentations, book chapters and editorials) and earned **36** awards.



FROM THE SCHOOL OF PHARMACY 2019:

61% OF FACULTY engaged in at least one presentation of their research and 22% OF STUDENTS were involved in scholarly projects.

Student Health Sciences Conference

The first Student Health Sciences Conference was launched in 2019 to promote collaboration across MCW and support the longitudinal discovery and career preparation process of MCW students. This new initiative pulled from campus-wide resources to **engage all students** in presentations, workshops and open house discussions on professional and career development within the health sciences. In its inaugural year, participants included **350 registered students** and **80 faculty and staff volunteers.**

- 1 DUAL DEGREE PROGRAM WITH MOUNT MARY (MPH)






