Vascular & Interventional Radiology Clerkship (M3, M4 preferred).

At what point in the interview season should a student consider applying to more residency programs in your specialty?

At the onset. These are rolling interviews. Waiting to apply will limit the number of invitations a candidate receives.

At what point should a student consider applying to a back-up specialty?

Take stock of your application and perceived competitiveness. Meet with an advisor to discuss your candidacy.

Recognizing that it can vary from year to year, when is the typical interview season for this specialty nationally?

Some will start earlier in October and extend into January, but most are end of October through December.

Do you have any additional recommendations for students who are committed to matching in this specialty?

Meet with an advisor. Do a rotation to confirm your understanding and true interest in the field.
