# Degrees Awarded

#### Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

The Doctor of Philosophy degree is awarded by MCW in recognition of marked ability and achievement in a particular field of biomedical science or public and community health. To earn the PhD degree, a student must submit a dissertation representing an original research contribution and complete a public defense of that

#### Doctor of Public Health (DrPH)

The Doctor of Public Health degree is a professional doctoral degree awarded by MCW in recognition of expertise in evidence-based public health practice and research. Students participate in a three-year curriculum that includes coursework, an applied practice experience, and a dissertation. Candidates for the DrPH degree must complete a dissertation that generates a field-based product consistent with advanced practice designed to influence programs, policies or systems addressing public health

#### Master of Science (MS)

The Master of Science degree is awarded by MCW for postgraduate study in a specific field of biomedical or translational science. A master's thesis that gives evidence of marked scholarly attainment in the student's major subject is required. Candidates for the MS degree must either complete a public defense of their thesis or pass a comprehensive examination based on their total graduate program.

#### Master of Arts (MA)

The Master of Arts degree is awarded by MCW in the field of bioethics. A comprehensive examination is required following completion of core coursework. Students may

choose between a thesis option and a non-thesis option. A master's thesis providing evidence of high scholarly achievement in the student's area of study must also undergo a public defense. The non-thesis option requires a final paper of publishable quality followed by an oral public defense. The MA program accommodates accelerated or part-time schedules. All degree requirements must be completed within four years, but the average is two years.

#### Master of Medical Physiology (MMP)

The Master of Medical Physiology degree is awarded by MCW for completion of a one-year program that is closely integrated with the first-year medical student curriculum at MCW. The program provides an experience comparable to that of a medical student, including examinations. It is designed to give students a deeper understanding of human physiology and for college graduates looking to strengthen their academic credentials in preparation for applying to US medical schools.

#### Master of Public Health (MPH)

The Master of Public Health degree is awarded by MCW for completing curricula focused on public health practice. The online program allows students to learn and apply evidence-based strategies for prevention and community health improvement initiatives. The program takes a broad approach to public health and graduates are prepared to work in leadership positions in a variety of settings such as governmental agencies, non-profit organizations, healthcare systems, community-based organizations, academic institutions, and other industries. Candidates for the MPH degree complete an applied practice experience and capstone project as culminating experiences to demonstrate mastery of public health competencies.

#### Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD)

The Doctor of Pharmacy degree attests to general knowledge in all fields of pharmacy. The degree is awarded by MCW for completion of the accelerated, three-year program comprised of comprehensive didactic education, robust skills development, and extensive clinical training related to pharmacy practice. The PharmD degree offers opportunities in clinical practice, research, teaching, pharmaceutical industry, manufacturing, judicial, and a multitude of other areas. Successful passing of the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination, Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination, and other state specific requirements are necessary for practice as a registered pharmacist.

#### Doctor of Medicine (MD)

The Doctor of Medicine degree attests to general knowledge in all fields of medicine as well as the foundational skills required for the practice of medicine. An MCW graduate is prepared to demonstrate problemsolving skills, knowledge of normal and abnormal states, the ability to acquire and utilize information in the clinical management of patients, and the empathic values and caring attitudes critical to the practice of medicine. All medical students are required to take and pass the United States Medical Licensing Examination Step 1 and Step 2- Clinical Knowledge, which are administered by the National Board of Medical Examiners.

Leadership



President
Chief Executive Officer

John R. Raymond, Sr., MD, joined the Medical College of Wisconsin as its sixth President and CEO in July 2010. He previously served as Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), where he had been a faculty member since 1996. Dr. Raymond leads Wisconsin's only private health sciences university, which includes the nation's third-largest private medical school. Under his leadership, MCW continues to be a leader of innovation as Wisconsin's largest private research institution. A practicing nephrologist with active roles in clinical care, teaching and faculty mentorship, Dr. Raymond also is a medical researcher studying the basic mechanisms of kidney cell function. He has published more than 140 full-length manuscripts

and earned nearly \$40 million in funding in his career. He is a member of the Association of American Physicians and the American Society for Clinical Investigation. Dr. Raymond is a member of the Board of Directors of the United Way of Greater Milwaukee and Waukesha County and served as Co-chair of the 2020 United Way Campaign. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin's Blood Research Institute. Dr. Raymond is the Past President of the Board of the American Heart Association of Metro Milwaukee. He recently was named as a 2024 Wisconsin Titan 100, which recognizes the state's most accomplished business leaders in their respective industries.



#### Interim Provost

Cheryl A. Maurana, PhD, is the Interim Provost, Stephen and Shelagh Roell Endowed Chair, Professor of Bioethics and Medical Humanities, Founding Director of the Kern National Network for Flourishing in Medicine, and Senior Vice President for Strategic Academic Partnerships. In her role as Interim Provost – which she assumed on January 1, 2025 – Dr. Maurana serves as the principal academic officer of the Medical College of Wisconsin and is responsible for the development, administration and execution of the academic and professional programs of the institution, as well as the education and welfare of MCW's learners. Additionally, she will lead a restructuring of the Provost's Office and chair a task force to develop a plan for MCW as a flourishing health sciences university of the future. The Deans of the MCW School of Pharmacy and School of Graduate Studies, and the Director of the Advancing

a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment (AHW), report directly to Dr. Maurana. Since joining MCW in 1995, Dr. Maurana has been responsible for expanding MCW's interinstitutional academic efforts and fostering collaboration among existing and new partners. She provided collaborative leadership for the development of MCW's regional medical education campuses and the creation of the MCW School of Pharmacy, launched the PhD program in Public and Community Health, and served as the first Senior Associate Dean for Public and Community Health, Founding Director of the Institute for Health & Humanity), and Founding Director of AHW.



#### Interim Dean, School of Medicine

**Deborah M. Costakos, MD, MS,** assumed the position of Interim Dean of the School of Medicine on January 1, 2025. She also serves as Professor of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences and was the Chair of that Department from January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2024, following 11 months in the Interim Chair role. As Interim Dean of the School of Medicine (SOM), Dr. Costakos is responsible for the conduct and advancement of the programs of the SOM; maintaining the highest standards of excellence in the academic affairs of the SOM; fostering competitive biomedical research programs; and ensuring high-quality patient care and engagement of communities to advance health for all. Dr. Costakos serves as the chief administrative and academic officer of the SOM and oversees the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) accreditation. She recommends primary or secondary faculty appointments for individuals

requesting appointments in the SOM and recommends appointments and reappointments to a named or endowed chair/professorship. Additionally, Dr. Costakos oversees MCW's Senior Associate Deans, Clinical and Basic Science Department Chairs, Institute and Center Directors, and the Deans of MCW's regional campuses in Central Wisconsin and Green Bay. Dr. Costakos received her MD from MCW in 1998. Following completion of her ophthalmology residency and fellowship in pediatric ophthalmology, she entered private practice. Since joining MCW in 2009, Dr. Costakos has developed a nationally recognized program for the care of infants with Retinopathy of Prematurity, started a pediatric ophthalmology fellowship, and prior to taking the chair role, served as Medical Director for Pediatric Ophthalmology.



Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration Chief Operating Officer

**Matthew Lester, MBA, MHA, CPA,** was appointed as Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration, and Chief Operating Officer, effective August 1, 2022. He serves as the principal administrative officer of the Medical College of Wisconsin and is a member of the institution's leadership team. Mr. Lester is responsible for MCW's financial functions as well as the planning, organizing, evaluating and monitoring of all administrative and facilities functions. He oversees strategic financial and administrative planning, budget development and implementation, policy formulation, facilities and organizational development. Additionally, he has oversight of facilities, central purchasing, information services and other institutional functions as required to support MCW's

missions. Mr. Lester possess more than 25 years of management experience leading and advising healthcare and higher-education organizations. He is a highly collaborative executive, combining strategic planning, operational acumen and business development expertise to develop actionable solutions for a broad array of challenges. Additionally, he brings a robust background of management consulting and financial leadership at two medical schools and experience working closely with hospital leadership to design and execute an aligned affiliation and joint strategy.



#### Senior Associate Dean for Education, School of Medicine

José Franco, MD, Professor of Medicine (Gastroenterology and Hepatology), was named Senior Associate Dean for Education in the School of Medicine in April 2022. He previously served as Interim Senior Associate Dean for Academic Affairs in the School of Medicine from April 2021 through April 2022. He also currently serves as Standardized Teaching and Assessment Resource (STAR) Center Director. Dr. Franco's extensive service to the education mission also includes his past roles as Discovery Curriculum Director and Associate Dean for Educational Improvement. Dr. Franco has witnessed and/or been involved in curriculum reform, innovation and excellence in teaching at MCW for more than 30 years. Dr. Franco is a member of MCW's Society of Teaching Scholars and received the institution's Distinguished Service Award in 2013.



#### Founding Dean, Medical College of Wisconsin-Green Bay

Matthew L. Hunsaker, MD, joined the Medical College of Wisconsin as the Founding Campus Dean for the Medical College of Wisconsin-Green Bay and Professor of Family and Community Medicine in January 2014. Dr. Hunsaker provides overall leadership and management of MCW's regional medical school campus in Green Bay and serves as the primary liaison for MCW's health system, academic and community partners in Northeast Wisconsin, as well as with MCW's Milwaukee campus. Dr. Hunsaker continues to serve as a national and international resource for medical education, Human Resources in Health (HRH), particularly in the design and scale-up of medical education, primary care and community-based medical teaching models.



#### Sentry Dean and Founding Dean, Medical College of Wisconsin-Central Wisconsin

Lisa Grill Dodson, MD, Professor of Family and Community Medicine, joined the Medical College of Wisconsin as Founding Dean for the Medical College of Wisconsin-Central Wisconsin in August 2014. She was named the Sentry Dean, MCW-Central Wisconsin, in December 2019. Dr. Dodson provides overall leadership and management of MCW's regional medical school campus in Central Wisconsin and serves as the primary liaison for MCW's health system, academic and community partners in that locale, as well as with MCW's Milwaukee campus. Dr. Dodson advocates for innovation in both medical education and care delivery to ensure the availability of high-quality care to rural and other non-urban populations. Her leadership has been recognized by the receipt of several awards, including the Oregon Family Physician of the Year in 2009 and the MCW President's Community Engagement Award in 2017.



#### Founding Dean, School of Pharmacy

George E. MacKinnon III, PhD, DMSc (Hon.), MS, RPh, joined the Medical College of Wisconsin in 2015 as Founding Dean and Professor of the School of Pharmacy. He also serves as Professor of Family and Community Medicine in the School of Medicine and Institute for Health & Humanity in the Graduate School. Dr. MacKinnon leads the MCW School of Pharmacy to deliver a dynamic and innovative Doctor of Pharmacy curriculum and to expand pharmacist care models in collaborative approaches to team-based care. He has held academic appointments in medicine and pharmacy engaging in clinical practice, research, teaching and academic administration, where he has helped to successfully establish four new academic pharmacy programs across the United States. His

non-academic appointments have included Vice President of Academic Affairs with the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy and Director of Global Health Economics & Outcomes Research at Abbott Laboratories. Dr. MacKinnon is a Fellow of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists, a Distinguished Scholar Fellow of the National Academies of Practice and was a recipient of an honorary Doctor of Medical Sciences degree from the Medical College of Wisconsin in 2022. Dr. MacKinnon serves on the board of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin and was installed as Chair of the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (AACP) Council of Deans (COD) in July 2024. Dr. MacKinnon will serve concurrently on the COD and the AACP board of directors through 2026.



#### Dean, School of Graduate Studies

Daisy Sahoo, PhD, was named Dean of the Medical College of Wisconsin School of Graduate Studies and the inaugural holder of the Women in Science Endowed Professorship effective February 1, 2024. She also currently serves as Professor of Medicine with secondary appointments in the Departments of Biochemistry and Pharmacology & Toxicology. As Dean of the School of Graduate Studies, Dr. Sahoo oversees all aspects of the Graduate School, which includes 41 different academic programs comprising doctorate, Master's and certificate programs. Dr. Sahoo joined the MCW faculty in 2007 as Assistant Professor of Medicine and rose through the ranks to Professor with Tenure in 2018. She served as Vice Chair for Research in the Department of Medicine from 2014–2024 and

as President of the MCW Faculty Council from 2020–2021. Dr. Sahoo's work has been supported by the NIH with continuous R01 funding since 2007, and she has directly generated more than \$7.1 million in total research funding to study cholesterol transport and cardiovascular disease. She received MCW's Women in Science Pioneer Research Award in 2021. Dr. Sahoo has mentored numerous undergraduate, medical and graduate students as well as postdoctoral fellows and faculty. Her mentoring efforts were recognized with the Department of Medicine's Mentorship Award, by MCW's graduate students with the 2023 Mentor of the Year award, and at the national level with a mentoring award from the American Heart Association.

# Elizabeth "Betsy" Brenner Chair of the Board



Elizabeth "Betsy" Brenner is an active volunteer in the Milwaukee community. Along with her service as a Medical College of Wisconsin trustee and member of its executive committee, she sits on the executive committees of the Greater Milwaukee Committee, and has held leadership roles in Planned Parenthood of Wisconsin, The Boys & Girls Club and Milwaukee Film.

Ms. Brenner stepped down in 2016 after more than three decades in the newspaper industry. She was named Publisher and President of the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel in January 2005, and also served as Executive Vice President of Journal Communications and its spinoff company, Journal Media Group. During her tenure at Wisconsin's largest newspaper, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel won three Pulitzer Prizes, including one awarded in 2011 that told the story of groundbreaking genomic research conducted at the Medical College of Wisconsin.

Prior to coming to Milwaukee, Ms. Brenner was President and Publisher of The News Tribune in Tacoma, WA and The SUN in Bremerton, WA. She had earlier leadership responsibilities at the Denver Rocky Mountain News, The Miami Herald and The New York Times. She began her career as a business news reporter at The Chicago Tribune.

Ms. Brenner attended Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill., where she received a Bachelor of Science degree in journalism in 1976 and Master of Business Administration degree in 1978.

# William Edward Finlayson, MD

**Doctor of Medical Science** 



William E. Finlayson, MD, who turned 100 years old in September 2024, has had a long and distinguished history of service in Milwaukee that dates back to his arrival in the city in 1958. He practiced obstetrics and gynecology for nearly 40 years, and was the first Black OB-GYN at what was then St. Joseph's Hospital and Mount Sinai Hospital – during which time he delivered approximately 10,000 babies. A street between West Capitol Drive and West Walnut Street – formerly North 5th Street – bears his name in honor of his service to Milwaukee.

Dr. Finlayson served in the Army for three years during WWII, achieving the rank of First Lieutenant. He received his BS degree from Morehouse College in 1948, where he was a classmate and Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity brother of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. Finlayson earned his MD degree in 1953 from Meharry Medical College and completed his residency at the University of Minnesota in 1958 — after which he settled in Milwaukee with his wife and young sons.

Dr. Finlayson quickly became aware of the more subtle forms of segregation in Milwaukee and made it his business to break down barriers and open doors for those less fortunate than himself. He was most interested in the city's institutions, particularly those with little to no Black representation. Dr. Finlayson served on the Board of the Medical College of Wisconsin and as a member of its Admissions Committee, was instrumental in increasing the diversity of the student body.

Dr. Finlayson is a Past President of the Milwaukee Gynecological Society and the Past National Chair of the section of Obstetricians-Gynecologists for the National Medical Association. He earned Fellowships in both the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the American College of Surgery, and as a member of the American Medical Association, served as a delegate to the state and county Medical Societies and lobbied for the passage of Medicare.

Medicine was far from Dr. Finlayson's only interest, however. He also was concerned for the economic health of his community. Noting that it was underserved by financial institutions, he was instrumental in the founding in 1971 of North Milwaukee State Bank - the first Black-owned bank in Wisconsin – and served as it Chairman of the Board for 26 of the more than 40 years of the bank's existence. Dr. Finlayson's social conscience prompted him to push for the establishment of a state-of-the-art YMCA facility on Milwaukee's near northside in the mid-1960s, and served as its President of the Board of Directors through groundbreaking and construction. In 1964, as President of the local alumni chapter of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Dr. Finlayson successfully led the effort to bring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to

Dr. Finlayson is a Golden Heritage life member of the NAACP and was a founding member of the Milwaukee African American Council. More recently, he organized the W.E.B. DuBois Club, which provides mentoring and guidance to young African American high school males. He also received Milwaukee's 2019 Living Legend Award.

Joseph J. Fins, MD
Doctor of Medical Science



Joseph J. Fins, MD, is *The E. William Davis, Jr. M.D. Professor of Medical Ethics* and Chief of the Division of Medical Ethics at Weill Cornell Medical College, where he also serves as a Tenured Professor of Medicine, Professor of Medicine in Psychiatry, Professor of Medical Ethics in Neurology, Professor of Medical Ethics in Rehabilitation Medicine, and Professor of Health Care Policy and Research. He is the Founding Chair of the Ethics Committee of New York–Presbyterian Weill Cornell Medical Center, where he is an Attending Physician and Director of Medical Ethics.

A member of the Adjunct Faculty of Rockefeller University and Senior Attending Physician at The Rockefeller University Hospital, Dr. Fins codirects, the Consortium for the Advanced Study of Brain Injury (CASBI) at Weill Cornell Medicine and Rockefeller. He also is the Solomon Center Distinguished Scholar in Medicine, Bioethics and the Law at Yale Law School and a Visiting Professor of Law. Dr. Fins has held visiting professorships at Princeton, Johns Hopkins, and Wesleyan University. Dr. Fins is the immediate Past President of the International Neuroethics Society, Past President of the American Society for Bioethics and Humanities, and current Chair of the Hastings Center Board of Trustees.

Dr. Fins graduated from Wesleyan in 1982 and received his MD degree from Cornell University Medical College in 1986. He completed his residency in Internal Medicine and his Fellowship in General Internal Medicine at The New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center, and has served as Associate

for Medicine at The Hastings Center. Dr. Fins is a Diplomat of the American Board of Internal Medicine.

The author of more than 500 papers, chapters, essays, and books, Dr. Fins' most recent volume is Rights Come to Mind: Brain Injury, Ethics and The Struggle for Consciousness (Cambridge University Press, 2015). He also is the author of A Palliative Ethic of Care: Clinical Wisdom at Life's End and was co-author of the 2007 Nature paper describing the first use of deep brain stimulation (DBS) in the minimally conscious state. Dr. Fins served as a co-investigator on an NIH BRAIN Initiative grant studying DBS in severe to moderate traumatic brain injury and was principal investigator on a BRAIN Initiative grant entitled, "Cognitive Restoration: Neuroethics and Disability Rights." He is currently MPI on a Ro1 entitled, "Post-trial Access, Clinical Care, Psychosocial Support, and Scientific Progress in Experimental Deep Brain Stimulation Research."

Dr. Fins is an elected Member of the National Academy of Medicine, a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the Association of American Physicians, and, by Royal Appointment, is an *Academico de Honor* (Honored Academic) of the Royal National Academy of Medicine of Spain. In 2022, Dr. Fins was awarded a Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa, from Wesleyan University, and he received the *Weill Cornell Medical College Alumni Association Award of Distinction* in 2024. Dr. Fins is currently working on a biography of the physician-humanist, Dr. Lewis Thomas.

Ellen M. Gilligan

Doctor of Humanities



Ellen M. Gilligan, a champion for strong communities and racial equity, has dedicated her entire career to driving resources to underserved communities and advancing equitable outcomes in education, housing, and economic development.

As President and Chief Executive Officer of the Greater Milwaukee Foundation (GMF) – a role she held from 2010 to 2024 – Gilligan joined Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) President and CEO Dr. John R. Raymond, Sr., in a groundbreaking collaboration focused on the social determinants of health, and bringing to life GMF's generational commitment to advance racial equity in the region. Both GMF and MCW had historic ties to the Brewers Hill, Halyard Park, and Harambe neighborhoods. This was an opportunity for them to invest deeply while embedding their institutions to catalyze longterm change.

With a shared vision for a Milwaukee that is equitable, healthy, and thriving for all, the CEOs of GMF and MCW assembled a visionary and collaborative team that homed in on the former Schuster's Department store building in Milwaukee's Bronzeville neighborhood to create a national model called ThriveOn King — a unique partnership of a private health sciences university, a community foundation, and an innovative, visionary African—American developer. The team steered deep involvement and engagement across multiple partners and throughout the community, bringing the vision to life. Most importantly, the collaboration was guided at every step by the vision, voices, and priorities of the area's residents.

ThriveOn King launched as a comprehensive community hub in June 2024, bringing together early childhood education, health and wellness, new housing and economic opportunity, and new business under one roof. Fulfilling residents' vision,


ThriveOn King is a community gathering place and showcase celebrating the history and culture of Bronzeville and renewing a long-dormant, iconic community asset for positive change.

Gilligan earned her Bachelor's degree from the University of Colorado, and postgraduate certificates from Northwestern University (strategic leadership) and the Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy (major giving). She has held executive leadership roles spanning more than 30 years with national and local nonprofits that invest in community development, including the Local Initiatives Support Corporation, The Milton S. Eisenhower Foundation, and United Way Worldwide – all in the Washington, DC area. She held executive roles with United Way of Greater Cincinnati and The Greater Cincinnati Foundation prior to joining the GMF.

Gilligan has brought her leadership skills as a catalyst and convener of community around shared vision to national and community boards, including the Greater Milwaukee Committee, the City of Milwaukee's Black Male Achievement Advisory Council; and United Way of Greater Milwaukee and Waukesha County, and recently joined the board of Wisconsin Watch.

One of Gilligan's proudest career accomplishments was overseeing the GMF's growth in assets from \$458 million in 2010 to more than \$1 billion in 2024. During her tenure, GMF also completed one of the nation's first community foundation campaigns, generating \$726 million to support GMF's vision of a Milwaukee for All. The campaign engaged thousands of donors in support of the "building blocks of a better life" — educational opportunity, health equity, economic inclusion, and housing security.

# Robert N. Golden, MD





Robert N. Golden, MD, is Dean Emeritus of the School of Medicine and Public Health, Vice Chancellor Emeritus for Medical Affairs, the Robert Turell Professor in Medical Leadership, and Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Wisconsin–Madison. He is also Past Chair of the Board of UW Health, the university's academic health system.

Dr. Golden received his BA *cum laude* with honors in psychology from Yale University, and his MD degree from the Boston University School of Medicine. He completed an internship, residency, and chief residency in psychiatry at the University of North Carolina (UNC), followed by a fellowship in pharmacology research at the National Institute of Mental Health. He returned to UNC in 1985 and over time, served as the Associate Director of both the General Clinical Research Center and the Mental Health Clinical Research Center, Chair of the Department of Psychiatry, and Vice Dean for the School of Medicine.

In July 2006, Dr. Golden became the 9th Dean of the UW School of Medicine and Public Health. Upon stepping down as Dean in May 2025, he was the longest serving dean at UW-Madison and the second-longest serving medical school dean in the United States. He remains on the faculty as a Professor in the Department of Psychiatry.

During his leadership tenure at UW-Madison, Dr. Golden led the transformation of the medical school into the nation's first School of Medicine and Public Health, which included the integration of public and population health principles into its education, research, and service missions. He also played a

critical leadership role in the integration of the academic group practice and the academic health system into a single physician-led organization, UW Health. Over the course of his service as Dean, National Institutes of Health (NIH) research funding grew from \$135 million to more than \$315 million; specialized training tracks in rural and urban medicine were created for medical students; multiple new centers were launched, including the Native American Center for Health Professions and the Institute for Clinical and Translation Science; and greater diversity was achieved among students, faculty, and institutional leaders.

Dr. Golden has published more than 250 academic papers and has served on several editorial boards, review panels, and advisory committees. His national appointments have included Chair of the Board of the Association of Academic Health Centers; President of the American College of Psychiatrists; Vice Chair of the Board of Directors of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology; and Associate Editor for *Psychosomatic Medicine* and *Neuropsychopharmacology*.

His honors include the Eugene Hargrove Mental Health Research Award and the American College of Psychiatrists Mood Disorders Research Award; appointment as the inaugural Stuart Bondurant Distinguished Professor at UNC-Chapel Hill; recipient of the Distinguished Medical Alumnus Award from the UNC School of Medicine and the Distinguished Alumnus Award from the Boston University School of Medicine; and the UW Slesinger Award for Excellence in Mentoring of women faculty.

I make these promises solemnly, freely, and upon my honor."




