

For Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Public Health, Master of Arts (with Thesis) and Master of Science Candidates, the general organization of the thesis/dissertation is:

- Title page
- List of Committee Member Names (no signatures)
- Abstract
- Table of Contents
- List of Tables
- List of Figures
- Acknowledgments (if any)
- Body
- Bibliography

The body may take either of two forms below:

- A unified form, as follows:
 - Introduction
 - Materials and Methods
 - Results (including tables and figures)
 - Discussion
 - Conclusions

OR

- A multi-part form, as follows:
 - General Information
 - Individual chapters each consisting of:
 - Introduction
 - Materials and Methods
 - Results (including tables and figures)
 - Discussion
 - Conclusions
 - General Discussion
 - General Conclusions

Specific Instructions:

- Margins: 1 inch on all sides.
- Page numbering: Number pages, including figures and figure legends, in the upper right-hand corner.
- Each chapter or section should start on a new page.
- All tables, figures and figure legends related to research findings should be in the results section(s) in a location appropriate to the content of the text.
- The Bibliography should contain complete references, including all authors, a complete title, and the inclusive page numbers. The specific format employed should be that appropriate to the journal in which the work would be published.
