# Master's Paper Formatting

- No minimum page requirement
  - Length should be based on project
  - Previous students' papers averaged 20-30 pages in length
- Formatting
  - Use consistent, easy-to-read, professional font
    - Examples: Times New Roman (12 pt.) or Arial (11 pt.)
  - Include page numbers
    - Top or bottom of page, centered or right-justified
  - Identify title & author on each page (in header/footer)

# Master's Paper Submission

- Iterative process
  - Must submit sections of paper at least three times
    - To Faculty Advisor, Second Reader, and Program Coordinator
- Deadlines are important
  - Submission schedules are posted on website
    - Unless otherwise specified in their proposal, students are expected to follow the timeline outlined
  - Deadlines differ for each semester and circumstance
    - Graduating students enrolled in Spring have condensed timeline
    - Summer semester has severely condensed timeline

## First Submission

- Outline
- Title page
- Introduction or background
  - May or may not include full literature review, depending on structure of paper
- Statement of purpose or research question(s)
  - May be included in intro/background or as separate section
- Methods
- References
  - Properly cited sources

Explanations of each section are provided in another presentation

## **Second Submission**

- Revised outline
- Revised first submission
- Literature review
  - If not incorporated into background or other previous section
- Results
- References
  - Properly cited sources

## Third Submission

- Revised outline
- Revised first and second submissions
- Discussion
- Conclusion
- Abstract
- References
  - Properly cited sources

# Sections of the Master's Paper

- Outline
- Title Page
- Abstract
- Introduction
- Purpose Statement
- Literature review

- Methods
- Results
- Discussion
- Conclusion
- References
- Appendices

# Graduating Student CSA (cont.)

- Level of Competency
  - Rank yourself as aware, knowledgeable, or expert
    - Definitions provided in instructions
- Courses & Activities
  - Which courses and which specific activities within those courses helped you achieve this competency?
- Evidence
  - If asked for proof of your competency, what could you provide?
    - Ex. papers, exams, assignments, activity descriptions, transcripts, resume, recommendations, etc.
