

## Environmental Health

- № 962 licensed establishments inspected by 2.4 FTE sanitarians<sup>4</sup>
  - ø 55 Cases of foodborne illness in 2010⁵
- № 192 of 8,000 active wells inspected annually<sup>6</sup> 

  Ø 30 cases of illness<sup>5</sup>
- ≥ 1,196 children screened for lead in 2010<sup>7</sup>
  - Representation of the property of the proper
  - ø 4 children met lead poisoning guidelines


