



Welcome to the Advocates in Medicine Pathway (AMP) student online application system! We are recruiting for our third AMP cohort and will accept applications from August 1st through November 1st.

What is AMP? What are the components and how long is the program?

The AMP program will support the professional development of individuals from Wisconsin interested in attending medical school at the Medical College of Wisconsin - Central Wisconsin to promote a diverse future healthcare workforce built around resilience, relationships, and system-based knowledge. The program cohort runs from January 2023 through July 2023. During the spring semester, individuals will attend the *virtual* 1-credit "Wicked Problems in Medicine" course* and *virtual* advising sessions in the evening. A clinical coordinator will work with the student to arrange a 1-week job shadow opportunity (community-based experiential learning) that fits their needs and interest. From June to July, the cohort will participate in the WI AHEC Community Health Internship Program (CHIP)** as full-time paid interns.

- Must be a sophomore or higher standing college student or already have obtained a Bachelor's degree
- Have a high interest in attending medical school
- Attend or plan to enroll for the "Wicked Problems in Medicine" course at UW-Stevens Point in Wausau (*virtual* and fully paid for)
- Preference will be given to individuals underrepresented in medicine, particularly from Hmong and rural backgrounds

What are the required attachments for the application?

In addition to the application, all applicants must attach (1) a current unofficial transcript or official transcript as proof of admission, (2) a current resume, and (3) include a personal statement describing their background and career goals as well as how they feel the AMP Program will benefit them in reaching these goals.
