
Learning Communities: Where Houses Become Homes in Medical Education

She is the faculty director of education at the HMS Center for Primary Care. She directed the BIDMC Internal Medicine clerkship from 1999-2015 and was the CME Editor for the New England Journal of Medicine from 2011-2014.

Dr. Fazio is a former chair of the Board for the Alliance for Academic Internal Medicine (AAIM), led the AAIM Undergraduate Medical Education Task Force on Competency-Based Medical Education, and cochairs the AAIM Women in Medicine Leadership Development Forum. She is the recent past-chair of the Learning Communities Institute.
